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| | EPA to clarify noise limits for the site EPA (Stacey) confirmed an improvement notice (legal notice) has been issued to Cleanaway relating to the landfill site requiring Cleanaway to complete a noise remediation action plan – the plan will look at proposing a noise limit for the site as well as identifying noise generating activities and to make an assessment as to whether appropriate measures or controls are in place to minimise unreasonable noise to be omitted from the premises. Rhonda (Cleanway) confirmed that at the last meeting hard copies of a noise assessment were handed out confirming that Cleanway were within the permitted noise protocols – Rhonda confirmed the EPA has asked for another noise assessment and action plan for how Cleanaway monitor noise – Rhonda confirmed previous noise management initiatives (bunds, containers, change out of old equipment. EPA (Stacey) confirmed that the plan asks for an assessment to identify all the noise generating activities, what are the gaps and what is proposed to minimise unreasonable noise. 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| | Ramya and Rhonda (Cleanaway) clarified that this amendment didn't cover quarrying activities – these were covered under a different permit (currently allowing 8am till 12noon on Saturdays outside normal business hrs. – not on Sundays or Public Holidays) Ramya (Cleanaway) confirmed that noise bunds at the site have been extended and improved Ramya (Cleanaway) confirmed that Cleanaway has engaged a consultant to complete the noise assessment (mentioned earlier) Ramya (Cleanaway) confirmed that Cleanaway has engaged a couple of noise complaints in the last two months relating to activities at the clay pit – used for the construction of Cell 5 (vehicle noise – 1 excavator and 2 haul trucks) Ramya (Cleanaway) confirmed odour curtains on Pomonal Rd, NW side of the active cell and next to the leachate pond and well as 2 aerators in the new leachate pond, mandatory truck washing on site departure (security cameras around the site) Ken stated that he'd been told some time ago that a landfill and quarry could not be operated on the same site (the quarrying activities impact the walls of the landfill) It was confirmed that Cleanaway have permits for both landfill It was confirmed that cleanaway have permits for both landfill and quarrying activities Lionel (ERR) comment post meeting: "Clearly there is an expectation that once quarrying is complete the cell will be excised from the work authority and an EPA licence will be the regulatory mechanism. 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| | Ryan (EPA) mentioned that the dust issue was something that the EPA are interested in and should be reported to EPA Ryan (EPA) mentioned that the Dept of Health have previously been involved in tank water issues, but that EPA would look into it Ken confirmed the positive impact of the new (and less impactful) reversing signal (tone) on the trucks Matt confirmed that the last ones were changed out a couple of days ago Ramya (Cleanaway) explained the process for minimising dust with the water trucks – Matt (Cleanaway) confirmed that the water truck runs continually on windy days Ramya (Cleanaway) presented the stormwater management plan for the site Ramya (Cleanaway) presented the gas extraction process Chris (Cleanaway) confirmed that the Stawell site was not large enough for a commercial waste-to-energy plant Ken mentioned an increasing presence of vermin (crows and foxes) Stacey (EPA) suggested that if there's a link between practices at the site and vermin numbers then it's something that should be reported to the EPA Roz lamented on the amenity of Pomonal Rd before the landfill site existed. | EPA to confirm a course of action for Janice (recommendation of an organisation who can do the water testing) Community members to advise on impacts of the new reversing tone at the next meeting Community members to report any negative impacts of vermin at the site. |
