



Cleanaway Lucas Heights Resource Recovery Park is a facility that accepts various waste types including putrescible or red bin waste, paper, cardboard, steel, scrap metals and vehicle batteries. The site includes the Lucas Heights Organic Resource Recovery Facility, which processes garden organic materials into compost for recycling.

Proposed Western Extension Project

Cleanaway plans to extend its Lucas Heights Resource Recovery Park landfill to meet the critical need for additional waste capacity in the Sydney basin. As the region's only putrescible landfill site, this extension is vital to address New South Wales' impending landfill shortage, with available capacity projected to run out by 2030 according to the NSW Government's Waste and Sustainable Materials Strategy 2041.

What is proposed?

Cleanaway's Lucas Heights landfill is expected to reach capacity by 2030. To extend its operational life, the Western Extension Project at Lucas Heights Resource Recovery Park will allow processing of up to 970,000 tonnes of Sydney's red bin waste annually until 2046, with activities starting in 2031.

The project will maintain existing environmental standards, generate electricity for around 25,000 homes through methane capture and renewable energy, and create employment opportunities.

In December 2024, the NSW Government released Secretary's Environmental Assessment Requirements (SEARs) on the NSW Major Projects Portal to guide the Environmental Impact Statement and community engagement for the project. Approximately two years after the landfill closure the new recreational spaces will be transferred to Sutherland Shire Council for management pending agreement between ANSTO and the Council.
