Cleanaway's Involvement at Erskine Park

The current landfill began operation as a quarry in the 1920s with the rock resource located in a volcanic neck which formed a prominent hill, approximately 500 m long, 300 m wide and 50 m above the adjacent creek level. Landfill operations commenced in 1994, originally under ownership of Enviroguard Pty Ltd (a joint venture between CSR and Cleanaway).

A development application was submitted to Penrith City Council in 1992 to rehabilitate the quarry via non-putrescible waste disposal. Approval was granted in 1992 subject to a number of conditions including requirements for site rehabilitation at the cessation of landfilling. The profile of the final landform will be compatible with the adjacent lands and adjoining industrial development.

It will form part of the Biodiversity Area providing connectivity between ecological corridors to the north and south. The landform and vegetation will be suitable for use for recreation in the context of public open space.

Cleanaway and Enviroguard were acquired by Transpacific in 2007. The site has operated under Environmental Protection Licence (EPL) Number 4865 in compliance with all regulations and is recognised in the industry as a best practice landfill.

Since being acquired by Transpacific, the landfill has operated free of any substantiated environmental or odour issues.

A number of environmental management initiatives have been implemented over the years including a leachate management system as well as the recovery of landfill gas. The landfill gas is piped to Austral Bricks at Horsley Park for use in clay brick manufacturing.

Cleanaway provides employment for approximately 120 people in the Erskine Park industrial area through the landfill and the Cleanaway Depot located nearby at 48 Quarry Road.

With final landform approaching completion, the landfill is expected to cease operations in 2016/2017.
