Proposed Waste Transfer Facility at Erskine Park

Cleanaway is an Australian waste management company. We are proposing to build and operate an enclosed Resource Management Facility at 50 Quarry Road, inside the existing Erskine Park industrial area. The project will be developed in two stages, the first being a Waste Transfer Station, and the second being a Resource Recovery Facility.

We're committed to engaging with local communities throughout this process, keeping you informed of our proposal and listening to your feedback. In our third community newsletter, we report on the progress of our proposal, and provide some information on your next opportunities to have your say.

Resource Recovery Facility

At the Community Drop In sessions, we presented preliminary information about a second stage to the proposed Erskine Park project. This second stage would involve the development of a Resource Recovery Facility, adjacent to the Waste Transfer Station. Collectively, the site would be known as the Erskine Park Resource Management Facility.

On 20 May 2015, we made a submission to the Department of Planning & Environment, describing the concept plan for the Resource Management Facility and asking for the Department to confirm the scope of the environmental assessment we're required to complete (Secretary's Environmental Assessment Requirements, or SEARs). The SEARs for the Resource Management Facility concept plan were published on 30 June and are available on the Department's website.



Next Steps

While we are proposing to develop the Resource Management Facility in two stages, our immediate focus is on completing the Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) for the proposed Waste Transfer Station (Stage 1). Prior to finalising the Stage 1 EIS, we will arrange a second community information session; we'll advise the date and venue for this shortly.

Following this session, we will finalise and submit the Stage 1 EIS to the Department of Planning & Environment, who will arrange for it to be placed on public exhibition for a period of at least one month. We will then hold a third community session during the public exhibition period. Members of the public will also be invited to make a submission to the Department regarding the proposal.

The project team will prepare a response to the submissions received which will be used by the Department, along with the EIS, as the basis of making a planning decision.

Later this year, we will also commence the environmental assessment and design process for the second stage of the project, the Resource Recovery Facility. We'll provide you with further information on the Resource Recovery Facility and the planning and consultation process at the second community information session.
